

BROWN COUNTY JUNIOR DIVISION RULES

1. Wisconsin Agriculture, Trade & Consumer Protection Chapter ATCP 160 govern fairs.
2. Any person who violates any of the following or special rules will forfeit all privileges and premiums as an exhibitor of the Brown County Fair for the current year.
3. The Brown County Fair Association reserves the right to interpret rules and regulations and resolve issues. All policy decisions are subject to the final approval of the Brown County Fair Association.
4. The chapter advisor, general leader, or person in charge of an educational group will be responsible for the entries of all the members of his or her group.
5. Entries are open to any boy or girl who is enrolled in good standing in a 4-H club, Future Farmers of America, Future Homemakers of America, Girl Scouts of the U.S.A., Boy Scouts of America or any other recognized youth organization under adult leadership with an educational program. Youth must be enrolled in the project area in which they are entering.
6. All projects must be the result of the youth's own work during the current year.
7. All entry forms must be postmarked by June 15th and mailed to the Brown County Fair Association, P.O. Box 195, Greenleaf, WI 54126 or dropped off at the Brown County Extension Office by June 15 or they will not be accepted (if June 15th is a Saturday or Sunday, the following Monday will be the deadline). Animal Stall, Pen & Cage Reservation form deadline is July 28th. Entry tags will be withheld if payment is not included with entry form.
8. Once entry forms are received by the Brown County Fair Office, there will be no opportunity to make changes or additions.
9. Entry tag errors. If the error is the fault of the Brown County Fair Office, there will be no penalty and a corrected entry tag will be written by fair personnel. If the error is the fault of the exhibitor, the entry will be judged, but the placing will be dropped one premium level.
10. Follow the specific department release times listed in this book. Anyone who removes, takes down or packs away anything (including items other than exhibits) prior to 6:00 p.m. Sunday without permission from the Exhibits Coordinator will forfeit the premium for that project.
11. The Brown County Fair Association assumes no responsibility for loss or damage to any exhibit during the progress of the Fair, or while en route to or from the Fair.
12. Security measures are taken during the fair. However, all exhibits will be displayed at the owner's risk. Exhibitors will be held responsible for any damage or accident caused by their entries.
13. Fair checks must be cashed by December 31 of the exhibit year. Fair checks not cashed by December 31 will be voided. Lost checks will not be replaced.
14. Vehicles are not allowed to be parked next to livestock barns from 7:00 a.m. on Wednesday through 6:00 p.m. on Sunday. Vehicles may unload near the barns, but must be moved in a timely manner. Trailers are to be parked only in assigned spots. Reservations must be made using the Trailer/Camper Reservation form found online at www.browncountyfair.com or by calling 920-606-5120. Forms are due to the Brown County Fair Office by July 28th. Deposit must accompany reservation in order to hold parking spot. Vehicles are not allowed to be parked in the fire lanes at any time. Vehicles or trailers parked in non-designated parking areas will be ticketed and towed at the owner's expense.
15. Brown County Fair Rules & Expectations for Exhibitors Staying Overnight at the Fairgrounds form must be turned in to the Brown County Fair Office by August 8th. This form can be found online at www.browncountyfair.com or by calling 920-606-5120. Exhibitors are allowed to stay overnight Wednesday through Saturday.
16. All exhibitors of animals are responsible for supplying their own feed and water. All animal exhibitors are responsible for feeding and watering their own animals. All animal exhibitors are responsible for cleaning the stalls/pens/cages that their animals have used.
17. For all departments 1-8, use the Animal Stall, Pen & Cage Reservation Form found online at www.browncountyfair.com or by calling 920-606-5120. Exhibitors in department 6 are required to pay a deposit of \$10 for each stall. Money will be refunded after the fair providing a horse occupied the stall for the duration. Reservations are due to the Brown County Fair Office by July 28th.
18. All stalls, pens, or cages must be completely cleaned out by Monday after the Fair at noon. Exhibitors whose stalls, pens, or cages have not been completely cleaned out by this time will forfeit their premiums.
19. To exhibit an animal at the Brown County Fair, youth must have been in at least the third grade during the current year.
20. No animal sales are permitted other than at the auction.
21. All persons participating in the fair agree to make no legal claim against the Brown County Fair Association, or person acting for or through the fair for loss, damage, or injury to property, animal or person.
