CLASS A – CLOVERBUDS

RULES

2. One participant ribbon per exhibit will be awarded to each exhibitor. No premiums will be given.
3. All posters must be on 14" x 22" poster board.
4. Each exhibitor is limited to 4 entries.
5. Only one entry per lot number.

1. Photographs you have taken; on poster board with captions; club projects or activities, 4
2. Story, poem or hand drawn picture about your club, its activities and projects
3. Exhibit made while exploring another club project
4. Self-portrait (i.e. painting, drawing, wall hanging, silhouette, clay, etc.)
5. Leather article
6. Ceramic or plaster-like item
7. Art project (drawing, painting, etc.)
