Exhibitors in this department are also eligible to exhibit in Department 10; Classes A, B, C and D. See Department 10 for arrival and judging time.

## GENERAL RULES:

### Stalls:

- 1. Exercise Times:** Exercise times will be posted in the barns. Please be sure to adhere to the times listed on these signs, as animals will be exercised in separate groups in order to maintain safety.
- 2. Feeding & Watering:** Animals must be fed, watered and exercised daily under the responsibility of the exhibitor. Barn aisles should be clear of show/tack boxes.
- 3. Reservations:** Animal Stall, Pen & Cage Reservation **Forms** are found online at: [www.browncountyfair.com](http://www.browncountyfair.com) or by calling Mary Kramer @ (920) 606-5120.
  - ➔ \$10 (Refundable) Stall Forms/Reservations must be submitted by July 15<sup>th</sup>.
  - ➔ **\*New:** Tack Stalls will be provided at no cost where possible & on a limited basis, and must be decorated. Smaller clubs may be asked to share a tack stall. Cleaning of the tack stall is the responsibility of the club(s) assigned to the tack stall & will be included as part of Herdsmanship Judging.
  - ➔ Deposit is refunded after the Fair providing the exhibit animal occupied the stall for the duration of the fair.
- 4. Stall Cleaning** **\*New:** In keeping with the expectations of good Herdsmanship, exhibitors will be expected to keep their stalls and aisles clean at all times. In order to comply with this expectation, clubs should bring their own barn cleaning items.

## Pre-Fair Requirements

- Exhibitors must be enrolled in the Horse Project or doing similar work in another Youth Organization to exhibit.
- Any youth exhibiting in the Horse Project at the Brown County Fair (with the exception of Class I) must have participated in a Safety Clinic and/or Evaluation conducted by their Organization.
- A participation list and evaluation results must be submitted by the advisor or educator of that organization to the Brown County Fair office **no later than** two weeks prior to the start of the fair.

### Exhibitors:

1. **Age of Exhibitor:** To determine the age of the exhibitor, use his/her age as of January 1<sup>st</sup> of the exhibit year.
2. **Class Entries:** All 4H members must enter Showmanship. Other class entries can be made at the exhibitor's discretion.
3. **Combining Classes:** The Superintendent and/or the Exhibits Coordinator reserve the right to combine or divide lots, in accordance with ATCP 160.04 and ATCP 160.07. If a question arises, the decision of the Exhibits Coordinator shall prevail.
4. **Description of Pre-Novice/Novice Levels:**
  - **Pre-Novice:** First Year Member / May show One Animal / Walk Trot Classes Only / No Cross Entering
  - **Novice:** 2<sup>nd</sup> Year+ of Horse Project / May Show 1 or 2 Animals / Walk Trot Classes Only / No Cross Entering

\*\*\*NOTE: Classes for those just beginning in the Horse Project may choose to enter in Pre-Novice or Novice Classes. These classes are meant to provide riders a positive experience in the Horse Project. These classes **do not** make the rider eligible for the State 4H Horse Show. Riders entered in these classes may not cross-enter into canter classes of any kind\*\*\*
5. **Disqualification:** Possible reasons for disqualification include, but are not limited to:
  - Exhibitors being coached from the rail
  - Animals worked or ridden by anyone except the exhibitor during the show
  - Unnecessary roughness with animals
  - Use of severe bits or spurs
  - Animal not under control by an exhibitor
  - Animals showing signs of lameness, unsoundness or unruliness
6. **Gymkhana:** Exhibitors may enter any number of Gymkhana classes in addition to the classes they entered in the Junior Pleasure Show.
  - **Exception:** Riders who entered Pre-Novice or Novice classes may not enter Gymkhana classes that require a canter.
7. **Horseless Horse:** Exhibitors in Horseless Horse classes may enter only Horseless Horse classes and are not eligible for Grand & Reserve Grand Champion classes.
8. **Junior/Open Show "Cross Entering":** **(\*New:)** Exhibitors showing in the Junior classes may cross enter into Open classes with the same horse and rider combination. **However**, the same combination cannot earn premiums in both the Junior & Open *for the same classes* (i.e. Jr. & Open Western Pleasure)
9. **Model Horse:** Model Horse Projects (Class I) will be judged face-to-face. Exhibitors need to be present at judging time (Tuesday, 6 pm in the Exhibit Building).

10. **Premiums:** An exhibitor will receive premiums for only his/her top 2 classes.
- Members showing 2 animals are eligible to earn premiums for their top 2 classes with *each* horse.
  - **\*NEW** ~Exhibitors can only be excused from a premium class with the authorization of the Horse Superintendent, the Exhibits Coordinator or other designated party & **must** submit the request no later than the evening preceding the show. **\*\*\*If an exhibitor does not show in a premium class and has not requested removal according to this policy, the exhibitor's eligibility for State Sponsored Events may be affected.\*\*\***
13. **Protective Apparel:**
- Exhibitors are required to wear equestrian boots (Heeled English or Western Boots) whenever they are riding or walking their horses/ponies. ***(An ounce of prevention is.... worth a pound of cure!)***
  - Closed toe shoes or equestrian boots must be worn when grooming horses/ponies OR cleaning stalls
  - Helmets are required (with safety harness securely fastened) when mounted or driving.
  - Helmets are not required for Halter or Showmanship Classes
14. **Sharing an Animal:**
- For families sharing a horse: the horse may be shared for Showmanship, Equitation/Horsemanship and Trail, but **not** in the same grade division.
  - The horse may not be double entered in Halter, Pleasure or Driving.
15. **Show Etiquette:** No one may approach the judge before or the Announcer's Stand during the show. (See "Wrong Class" below).
- Directed technical questions (tack changes, etc...) to the Gate Person or a Horse Project member.
  - Reserve questions for the judge until after the show is completed for the day.
16. **Tack Changes:** The entry gate can held a maximum of 2 minutes. Exhibitors requiring a tack change must notify the gate person of the request a minimum of 2 classes before their class is called.
17. **Walk/Trot Classes:** Exhibitors in walk/trot classes cannot cross enter into canter classes on the same horse.
18. **Wrong Class:** **\*New:** Animals entered into the wrong class will be not be judged, but will be allowed to leave the ring and enter the correct class. It is the responsibility of the exhibitor to know which class he/she should be entered in & report the change to the Gate Person or a Horse Project Member. ***\*Please see Rule 10 for State Horse Show Eligibility.***

## Animals:

1. **Age of Animal:**
- To determine the age of your animal, use your horse/pony's age as of January 1<sup>st</sup> of the Exhibit Year.
  - All foals must be weaned prior to the fair and will be stalled separately from the dam.
2. **Clipping:** For safety reasons, animals cannot be clipped in the aisles. Please contact Carl Falish (Beef Superintendent) for alternative options. Failure to comply may result in loss of premiums and/or removal from future fair entry.
3. **Coggins Test:** All horses must have a valid negative Coggins Test.
- Before unloading any horse, you must show a Horse Team Member the original and provide a copy for the Brown County Fair Association to retain
2. **Handling:**
- Only the Horse Project Members, Horseless Horse Project Members and their immediate families may handle the project animal(s).
  - For safety reasons, horses/ponies cannot be cross-tied in the aisles.
  - Exhibitors may allow fair visitors to pet their animal(s) as long as the animal is haltered & under the control of the exhibitor.
  - Horses must be saddled and bridled appropriately when being ridden. Halters are not considered appropriate riding gear.

3. Lunging may be done in the arena during scheduled exercise time only. \*Please contact the Exhibits Coordinator (Mary Kramer) or Horse Superintendent (Noelle Weis) to request exception to this rule.
4. Horses, ponies, and foals may not be let loose in the arena at any time. \*Please contact the Exhibits Coordinator (Mary Kramer) or Horse Superintendent (Noelle Weis) to request exception to this rule.
- Grazing is allowed in the area by the arena and west of the horse barn. When grazing, the horse must be controlled by a halter and lead line and the exhibitor must remain standing at all times.

4. **Leasing:** Equine project animals must be leased by March 1 of Exhibit Year.
- A "Leased Project Animal" is owned by someone other than the exhibitor or his/her family.
  - A copy of the lease agreement must be sent to the UW-Extension Office by June 1.

5. **Ownership:** Equine project animals must be purchased/owned by March 1 of Exhibit Year.
- The project animal is owned by the exhibitor or his/her immediate family.

6. **Pony Measurements:**
- All ponies/miniature horses 56" & under may participate in pony or miniature horse classes **only**.
  - Any ponies/miniature horses in question will be measured.

**PREMIUMS:** 1<sup>st</sup> - \$8.00    2<sup>nd</sup> - \$7.00    3<sup>rd</sup> - \$6.00    4<sup>th</sup> - \$5.00

***\*Classes will be judged according to the most recent rules and regulations from the Wisconsin State 4-H Horse Association. Only participants enrolled in the horse project in an organized 4-H club will be eligible to participate in the State 4-H Horse Show.***

**\*Pre-Novice:** A 1<sup>st</sup> year Horse Project Member who has never shown any horse/pony at any COMPETITION. Walk/Trot Only.

**\*Novice:** A Horse Project Member beyond his/her 1st Year of Showing at the Fair who has not Shown any Animal in a Canter Class. Walk/Trot Only.
